On an annual basis, the senior pastor is required to submit a written report to the Charge Conference. It has been my practice for many years that I also share the report with the entire congregation via the church newsletter. By doing so, it is my hope that a culture of transparency is

encouraged within the faith community.

Pastor's Report to Charge Conference

In June of this year, we gathered at Lakeside for the 2019 East Ohio Annual Conference. The theme was "Bearing Fruit that Lasts: Committed." Throughout this past charge conference year, Westlake UMC has worked to be committed to live out the mission and vision of this congregation locally, within our worldwide denomination, and as part of the Church universal.

We have worked with purpose to stay committed to share the universal love of Christ to those beyond the doors of our local congregation. Last November, leaders from Westlake UMC joined with those from many different faith traditions to stand in solidarity with our those of the Jewish faith in the wake of the mass killing of worshippers at the Tree of Life Congregation in Pittsburgh. We worshipped together during a Solidarity Shabbat service

at B'nai Jeshurun Congregation in Pepper Pike. This past August, we gathered with leaders from ELCA, Roman Catholic, and UCC congregations in Westlake for a quiet prayer walk of the new elementary school across the street from our suburban campus in Westlake. In October 2019, I was honored to be invited by Bishop Malone to participate in an ecumenical formation retreat of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and United Methodist Church Coordinating Committee.

Westlake UMC continues to stay committed to our worldwide connection through payment of apportionments, through a portion of our special Easter offering being sent to Africa University, and our work with the Methodist Church of Cambodia. A portion of our special Christmas Eve offering was given for scholarships for young Methodists in Cambodia. In January, Westlake UMC joined with teams from Berea UMC and Jefferson UMC for a two-week mission trip to Cambodia. Our Associate Pastor, Rev. Paige Boyer, traveled to Cambodia during the summer with a mission team from the East Ohio Conference. She took with her 99 personal hygiene kits for girls, that were hand made by individuals from Berea UMC and Westlake UMC. Throughout this past charge conference year, we also stayed committed to our worldwide connection through study and prayer as our

denomination continues to wrestle with the issues of human sexuality in the church.

Locally, WUMC has been very focused on being committed to our vision of bearing fruit that will last on the Westside of Cleveland through the ministries of our multi-campus church in the western suburbs and in our metro west mission field in the city of Cleveland. The mission of this local congregation is, "To Live So That Others Will Want to Be Followers of Jesus." In the past charge conference year, we have lived out this mission through community meals twice a month (once a month in both our metro west mission field and our suburban mission field), a monthly food pantry, community events like Trunk or Treat, Clue Into Easter, kick-off Sunday community barbeque, and a planned live musical nativity scheduled for December.

As we move into a new charge conference year, we will be identifying and implementing ministries to reach the communities from Ohio City, through Gordon Square, out to the W. 90th area. We will also be identifying the locations for these ministries. Another major initiative in our second year of being a multi-campus church, is the disposition of our building at W. 86th and Clark Avenue. We will vote on the sale of the building at the charge conference on November 9th and move forward accordingly. We continue to be committed to be in ministry with all of the communities within our metro west mission field and look forward to the opportunities to reach new people, younger people, and a more diverse people as we move into 2020.

In the midst of the divisions within our denomination regarding the issue of human sexuality, we will continue to be a faith community that seeks to fully live into our identity while staying committed to our mission of living our lives so that others will want to become followers of Jesus Christ. I continue to be honored to serve as your pastor and I look forward to traveling this journey together. It is an exciting season in the life of WUMC. Simultaneously, it is also a time filled with anxiety, both within our denomination and in the local church. I ask that as we move into this new charge conference year, we move together in prayer and service committed to being the hands and feet of Christ in this broken world.




