News and Committee Reports (cont.)

UPDATE ON SIMPSON METRO WEST BUILDING

In October, Leadership Council approved the decision to begin the process of selling the existing Simpson Metro West building (8519 Clark Ave., Cleveland), relocating ministries and activities to other nearby sites and ceasing services and activities in the current building.

This has been approved by the North Coast District Committee on Church Location and Building and during the WUMC Charge Conference.

While decisions about the building were being made, a separate team, including active members from each of our campuses, of has been focused on assessing ministry needs and possible locations for those ministries throughout our entire mission field in the city of Cleveland.

As this work continues, we are able to provide an update of some of the work as it is in progress.

Sale Process: We have begun initial meetings with a realtor to prepare the building for sale. This realtor has been the realtor on the sale of several UMC church buildings in recent years and brings an important perspective to our process.

Worship Plans: The sale process will take time, so, for the foreseeable future, we will continue to hold Sunday Worship services at 8519 Clark Ave. We are also continuing to seek a new space for weekly worship.

Preparing the Building: Building clean-up and clean out has begun, beginning with gathering of historic documents and materials that will be sent to the East Ohio archives at Ohio

Wesleyan University. As clean out continues, we ask that if you have personal items stored anywhere in the church that you take them home or dispose of them as appropriate.

Stained Glass Windows: We have started to gather names of those people who donated to the stained-glass windows in the sanctuary so that they might be given the window they dedicated. There are a few that will be kept by the church and more details on the remaining windows will be forthcoming.

Building Partnerships: We have been in discussions with West Side Community House (9300 Lorain Ave.) as a possible site for some of the ministries of the Church. After several discussions, we will be partnering with them to move adult and youth bible studies into their building during January. In addition, we'll be partnering with them to offer a new women's bible study in addition to our existing study.

Community Meal: The community meal on January 5 will be the final community meal at 8519 Clark Ave. We will invite those who attend the meal, we provide at West Side Community House on the Third Tuesday of every month along with its accompanying program. We will also direct people to the weekly meal during Bread on Bridge at the Nehemiah Mission on Tuesdays at 5:30.

Food Pantry: Understanding the importance of the food pantry for this community, the committee is working hard to find ways to continue this vital community service. Until a solution is identified, the food pantry will continue on the last Wednesday of the month.

Rise Against Hunger is driven by the vision of a world without hunger. Elijah: Spiritual Stamina in Every Season with Melissa Spoelstra

Life is like a rollercoaster. One day it seems that everything in life is good, and the next day it can feel like everything is falling apart. Then there are those in between days when we're coasting along without much thought to the highs or lows. The prophet Elijah experienced this rollercoaster ride as well. One moment he was hiding out in the wilderness during a famine, being fed by the ravens, and the next he was on the mountaintop where God showed up in a powerful way with fire and then rain. Even Elijah grew weary of all the ups and downs, telling God, "I have had enough" (1 Kings 19:4). He needed spiritual stamina in order to keep on going and fulfill all the plans God had for his life. We do too!

In this six-week study grounded in 1 and 2 Kings, we will examine the life of the prophet Elijah, an ordinary man who did extraordinary things for God in the midst of the highs and lows of life. We'll learn some of the spiritual stamina secrets that helped him to hold on and persevere in faith, including practical habits related to making decisions, caring for the soul, accepting his circumstances, mentoring, and finishing well—which was his ultimate legacy. Whether we're currently in a mountaintop season where we're experiencing God's power and blessing, a valley season where we feel like running away, or somewhere in between, Elijah's life will inspire us to go the distance in the life of faith. Best of all, his story will challenge us but not shame us, because we'll discover that Elijah was just as human as we are. He doubted and struggled just as we do, but ultimately, he chose to believe God. As we study his life, we will grow in faith and develop spiritual stamina that will help us not only to survive but actually thrive in every season.

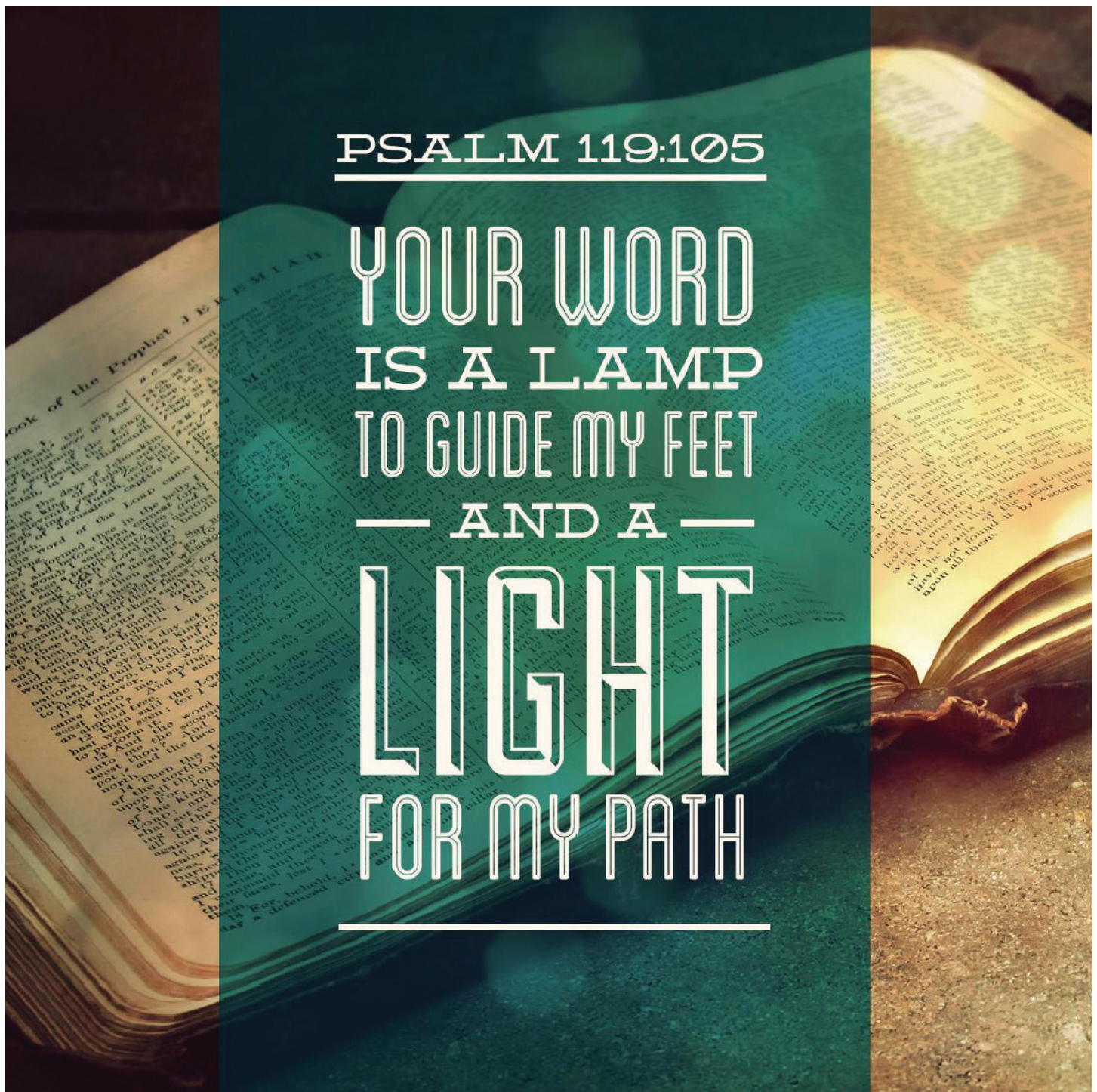
