A Holy Journey

They were building a hotel for Christians traveling to the Holy Land and they found a first century synagogue

as they dug for bedrock. This is how they found the ancient city of Magdala – home of Mary Magdalene. Since it's uncovering in 2009, Magdala has become an architectural site, guesting housing and home to Duc In Altum – a worship center whose name derives from Jesus' instruction to Peter in Luke 5:4 to put out into deep water.

At Duc In Altum, we visited the Encounter Chapel on the lower level of the center. There we entered into a time of reflection and impromptu worship. In this place, I was moved to tears as a sense of Christ's place in history washed over me.

Mary Magdalene is one of my spiritual heroes. She was the first person to encounter Jesus after his resurrection and the first person to share the Good News that he had risen from the grave. It is no surprise to me that in her hometown, not far from the very synagogue where she would have worshiped, I had the most spiritual moment during my journey to the Holy Land.

My trip was an opportunity not only to walk where Jesus walked, but to also walk with those carried on his work.

We drank from the well where Jesus met the Samaritan Woman. We touched the rock where Jesus fed fish to his disciples after the resurrection. We saw the traditional site of Mary's visit from the Angel Gabriel. We saw the place where Peter's mother-in-law may have lived in Capharnaum.

Jesus' journey was never something he did alone – not until the very end. He walked with close friends, relatives and even strangers. As we enter the season of Lent, we will be inviting you to walk your spiritual journey both with Jesus and with one another.

As interesting and deeply spiritual as the places we went were, it was the people who really made my trip to the Holy Land special. I'm so blessed to have taken this journey with dear colleagues and friends with whom I now share new and deeper connections.

Find people to join you on your spiritual journey so that you too can enjoy sharing in God's presence. As Lent begins this year, we'll be introducing new Life Groups that can help you connect with God through relationships with one another. I hope you'll give them a try.
